The University was founded in 1635.

Law has been taught since 1667.

2006: the Faculty was named a Place of Excellence in recognition of its outstanding results in higher education.

2010: ELTE received the title of Research University.

There are justices of the Constitutional Court and renowned public dignitaries among the teachers of the Faculty.

Diplomas issued by the Faculty are valued at home and abroad.

The Faculty has done well in rankings in excellence of instructors and students and awards at the National Scientific Student Associations' Conference.

BRIEF HISTORY

It was a milestone in the history of the University when in 1667 the combined estates of Imre Lósy and György Lippay, both of them cardinals and archbishops of Esztergom, were used to found the Faculty of Law. Alongside canon law and Roman law, emphasis was placed on teaching Hungarian substantive law and procedural law. Tenets of *jus commune* were taught expressly to rectify the shortcomings and crudeness of domestic jurisprudence at the time. The teaching of Hungarian law began in 1672 at two departments. The subject of the theory of Hungarian law included Hungarian substantive law and the practice of Hungarian law included the law of legislation. Until the *Ratio Educationis* was issued (1777), tuition took place at five departments: the Department of Roman Law, the Department of Canon Law (both operated right from the beginning), two departments where Hungarian law was taught and the Department of Natural Law.

A new curriculum was introduced in the wake of the *Ratio Educationis*. In addition to the tenured instructors, so-called extraordinary instructors could be hired to ensure the teaching of new subjects. The instructor of Roman law had to teach criminal law as well; and the instructor of Hungarian law had to teach, among other things, statistics about the countries of Europe and principles of Hungarian public law. Efforts were made to establish a department of the history of Hungarian law, but Empress Maria Theresa refused permission. With time the assortment of subjects multiplied. Most of the new subjects were proposed by the Court in Vienna, but the study of Hungarian law and the history of Hungarian law also developed with some delay. There was no direct correspondence between the number of subjects and departments as some professors taught three or even four subjects. Once a subject managed to gather a strong following, the related department was soon to be set up. By the twentieth century it had become established practice that programmes taught as majors had a department of their own in all cases.

Today the Faculty has 16 Departments, the Center for Theory of Law and Society and the Institute of Political Sciences. The Faculty of Law trains Juris Doctors and a relatively smaller number of political scientists, public administrators, and criminologists.

ADDENDUM

TO THE MONROE E. PRICE MEDIA LAW MOOT COURT COMPETITION RULES 2021/2022 COMPETITION YEAR

- EXTRACT -

- e) Each team shall have thirty (30) minutes to present their arguments with an additional three (3) minutes for rebuttal and sur-rebuttal respectively.
- f) The Applicant is forbidden from making new legal arguments in the rebuttal and may only respond to arguments raised by the Respondent in the course of the main pleadings. The Respondent team may only use their sur-rebuttal time if the Applicant team exercises its right to rebuttal. The sur-rebuttal must respond only to the points that the Applicant makes during the rebuttal.
- g) Each team may divide its thirty (30) minutes between the two oralists provided that no oralist is allocated less than ten (10) minutes or more than seventeen (17) minutes for the oral pleadings. This must be communicated to the Bailiff at the start of the session, before the round begins.
- h) The order of the pleadings in the Virtual Round of the Competition will be: Applicant 1, Applicant 2 and then Respondent 1, and Respondent 2, and the Applicant rebuttal speaker followed by the Respondent sur-rebuttal speaker.
- i) Only two (2) team members shall present the arguments during an Oral Round on a team's behalf.
- j) The judges are empowered to intervene with questions during the presentation of Oral Pleadings.

Dr. Miklós Klenanc

is an attorney-at-law and mediator working in cooperation with Réti, Várszegi & Partners Law Firm PwC Legal Hungary. He is fluent in Hungarian, English, Serbian and Croatian. He is focusing particularly on dispute resolution, including non-conventional legal remedies (requests for a preliminary ruling of the Court of Justice of the European Union, constitutional complaints, applications at the European Court of Human Rights, etc.) and ADR, and liability issues, including those related to AI. He holds an LL.M. in comparative constitutional law with EU specialization from Central European University. Between 2017-2020 he was the Hungarian national representative of the International Association of Young Lawyers (AIJA). He was a Professor at the Faculty of Law of Eötvös Loránd University and at the Faculty of Law of the University of Szeged where from 1992 till 2017 he was the Head of the Department of Political Sciences. He served at the Hungarian Constitutional Court as a chief counsellor, a secretary-general and since 2006 as an elected Judge. He was also the President of the Hungarian Constitutional Court from 2008 until 2015. Between 2005 and 2013 he was a member of the Venice Commission of the Council of Europe and presently is its Honorary President.

Dr. János Tamás Papp

is a media specialist and research fellow at the Institute for Media Studies of the National Media and Infocommunications Authority and a lecturer at Pázmány Péter Catholic University. He graduated from the Faculty of Law of Pázmány Péter Catholic University, where he finished his PhD studies in 2019. His main research fields are freedom of expression and media law, and issues related to freedom of expression on social networking sites.

Dr. Igor Popović

is a senior teaching and research assistant at the University of Banjaluka, (International Law Department). He holds an LL.M. from the University of Belgrade, and he is a PhD candidate at the same university (researching on freedom of expression and the Internet). In December 2010 Dr. Selanec started work at the Office of the Ombudsman for Gender Equality as a senior legal advisor, and in January 2012 he was appointed Deputy Ombudsman for Gender Equality, a position he held until his election as Judge of the Constitutional Court of Croatia in October 2017.

Dr. Tibor Sepsi

is an expert on constitutional law, information rights, and public administration. He currently is an attorney-at-law as a member of Budapest Bar Association with a litigation practice in human rights cases including legal representation at the European Court of Human Rights. He graduated and obtained an LL.M. in legal drafting at the Eötvös Loránd University (where he is a lecturer on constitutional law). Until 2010 he was a civil servant in various leading positions of the Hungarian governmental administration.
